Total marks are 168, with 8 for SPAG.

Paper 1 - Medicine in Britain/Western Front 30% , 52 marks (36 thematic and 16 historic environment) 1 hr 15.

Paper 2 – Superpower Rivalry/Anglo-Saxons and the Normans 40%, 64 marks. 1 hr 45.
